Health Watch

Medical Practice Act

The North Carolina Integrative Medical Society has requested the General Assembly to correct loopholes in the Medical Practice Act that has allowed the North Carolina Medical Board to harass Integrative Medicine physicians. About 20% of Integrative Physicians have been investigated by the NC Medical Board. There was no patient harm regarding any of the investigations.
